

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING PALM SPRINGS FRONT RUNNERS & WALKERS DECEMBER 12, 2018

The meeting was called to order at 6:04 pm. Present and constituting a quorom were Brian Eggert, Michael Ambrose, Reese Nottingham, Craig Wortendyke, DeLon Gobeli and Curtis Channell. The Board minutes from November, 2018, were approved unanimously.

Michael reported that the final numbers for the Pride Race are not totally complete, but he will have them in time to make the check presentation to the LGBT Center at the Front Runners circle on Saturday, December 15. The Board voted unanimously to donate the entire race proceeds to the Center. The amount donated will be more than last year. Brian noted the check presented to Mike Thompson of the Center will have to be signed by two signatories on the bank account, due to the amount.

Reese presented the current finanacial statement, which was approved unanimously by the Board. Reese will try to break down the line items under the "Miscellaneous" account in future reports.

DeLon said that 175 people have signed up for the holiday dinner at Broken Yolk Cafe, with a capacity of 192. The general consensus of the Board was that table cloths will not be used at the dinner. 35 people have become paid Members in order to attend the dinner. DeLon said this will be the second largest crowd at a Front Runners social event.

The December 13 bus trip to the Mission Inn in Riverside had attracted 53 participants, 25 Prime Timers and 28 Front Runners, filling up one bus. A check for \$256 would go to the Front Runners and a check for \$232 would go to the Prime Timers from the trip proceeds. DeLon feels that the mixed social events with the two clubs is working well.

Curtis reported that there are currently 412 Front Runner Members. He also reported that he now has the remaining Pride t-shirts, and will be selling them at the Christmas dinner for \$10.00. In regards to the Veteran's Day parade, Brian noted that the response was low for our participation, so he decided to cancel our contingent. He and Curtis will try to organize a group again next year.

Brian, DeLon and Reese will comprise the nominating committee for next year's Board elections in March. Brian stated that if no one volunteers to take over as newsletter editor, the newsletter will no longer be published. Tom needs to be given a copy of the new Club logo for the newsletter, according to Michael.

The Board approved unanimously the following: another year of Membership and Liability Insurance through the Road Runners Club of America (RRCA) in the amount of approximately \$1896 (actual amount will be based on the total number of Members when the fees are paid); renewal of membership in the International Front Runners; and another year membership in the Desert Business Association. The Board also approved unanimously to keep the annual Membership fee at \$30 for 2019. Brian asked for suggestions for questions that can be added to the Membership application (military background, volunteer support, types of emails received, etc.). The Board approved unanimously to make year-end donations to the following organizations: \$1,000 to Mizell Senior Center; \$500 to AAP-Food Samaritans; and \$500 to Desert AIDS Project. The Board also decided to participate in the following 2019 events: the Health and Fitness Expo in January; Info-A-Go-Go Community Expo at the Hyatt Hotel in January, and the Cathedral City Diversity Days bed race in March.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:15 pm. The next meeting will be held on Thursday, January 10, at 6:00 pm.


